FY 2019 CRC Training

★**Training for Child Abuse and Neglect (CAN) Prevention Regional Trainers:** This training is for instructors of (1) Training for Regional Council of Countermeasures for Children Requiring Aid, (2) Pre-Assignment Class for Newly Assigned Child Social Workers in Child Guidance Centers(CGCs), and (3) Training for Newly Assigned Child Social Workers in CGCs.

★**Training for Lawyers in CGCs:** The themes of this training are statutory responsibilities of CGCs, the roles of CGC's lawyers and securing children's best interests.

★**Joint Training for Senior Staffs in Child Welfare Institutes -Temporary child custody centers and Approach to team work:** The Themes of this training are risks and needs, and Family relationships.

★**Training by theme “Loss Experiences”:** Through lectures and a symposium, participants will learn about and discuss experiences of child loss and grief care.
