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FY 2020 CRC Training

The training summary of fiscal 2020 in now available on our website. The special topic for next year's training is the open lecture. Invited as the lecturer is Professor Eileen Munro, Emeritus Professor of Social Policy in the Department of Social Policy, London School of Economics, the author of "The Munro Review of Child Protection" that affects the reform of the UK child protection system.

As the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games will take place between July and September, training will be conducted while taking into account the impact of traffic and accommodation.

[Highlights of 2020 CRC training]

We will hold 25 training courses in 2020. We update the subjects and contents to respond to the issues of strengthening the Child Guidance Centers (CGCs) and scaling down of child welfare facilities while augmenting their functionality.

• Training for Doctors in CGCs Jun. 24

Beginning 2020, the basic content of the training will be covered in a period of one day.

• Joint Training for Staffs in CGCs Nov.17-19 Public health nurses will be able to participate.

Special training for lawyers in CGCs Jan.26-27
We will add practical report to make the contents more specific.

Information

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During the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games, traffic, transportation and accommodation are expected to be overcrowded. For this reason, Training for Child Psychologists and Doctors in Related Organizations will be held at "Nishi Nihon Kodomo Kenshu Center Akashi, while Training for Lawyers will be held in January. Child Social Worker Supervisor Step Up Training (not mandatory one) will be suspended.

• Open lecture Dec. 1 Venue: Yokohama -Learning from the UK child protection reform

Prof. Munro pointed out in the Munro Review that the UK's child protection system was being over bureaucratic and concerned with process compliance, and had no longer had the capacity to make professionals decisions for social workers, and that it needed to be more child centered with a focus on provision of effective help. The lecture introduces some ideas that should serve as an example for Japan.

Training by theme Mar.2-3

-Parents' mental ill health and child-rearing

We will explain the influence of schizophrenia and mood disorder on child care and introduce community resources that can provide support.
